Mustang excitement

The automobiles we drive say a lot about our lifestyles and how we perceive ourselves. They are a reflection of our image. Mustang is a fun-to-drive car. It breeds excitement. The LX series, in 2-door sedan, 2-door hatchback or convertible is a perfect example. It has fresh, appealing new looks, responsive fuel-injected performance, sure-footed handling. And it also has

electronically controlled, multiple-port fuel injection for more power and quicker response. That's an advancement you can feel. And for 1987, a 5-speed manual transmission with overdrive is standard.

A comfortable, functional interior

Mustang LX interior (see pages 6-7) is comfortable and functional with all controls placed within easy reach and all gauges placed in clear view.

Mustang LX Convertible

Mustang LX also comes in a convertible (shown on pages 2-3) complete with a power retractable top, rear glass window, roll-down quarter windows and room for four. The glass rear window can be unzipped and folded down with the top up for added ventilation. To add to the substance of the interior, you can order the articulated sport seats with leather seating surfaces.

The unmistakable look of Ford

Air flow management plays a large part in the exterior styling of every new Ford. The dynamic new styling of the 1987 Mustang is part of that philosophy. From the smooth wraparound bumpers and aero-style headlamps to the flush glass of the quarter windows, Mustang reflects the look that is on the leading edge of technology — a look that is unmistakably Ford.

Port fuel injection for efficiency and response

Technical advances aren't limited to what you can see, either. The 2.3 liter 4-cylinder engine has been redesigned to incorporate new elec-

The bucket seats are cloth-trimmed and recline for individualized comfort. Full instrumentation includes tachometer, oil, temperature and battery charge gauges.

Other niceties that serve to complete the LX story are: electronic AM/FM stereo search radio (may be deleted for credit); interval wipers; dual covered visor mirrors; digital clock; dual remote control mirrors; center console with armrest, ashtray and lighter; and turbine wheel covers.

There's a lot to be excited about in a Mustang LX. Its performance, equipment and price add up to a smart purchase.

An option that enhances the engine compartment

Imagine a Mustang LX with the power of the Mustang GT. Imagine 225 horses* of port fuel-injected performance connected to your right foot. Sound like fun? Then order the 5.0L EFI HO V-8 engine package. It adds a nice touch to the engine compartment. Of course, it does nice things to the suspension, too, because it includes everything that goes with the GT. And if it weren't for the wider, low profile performance tires and 5.0 liter fender badges, no one would know the difference — at least not right away.

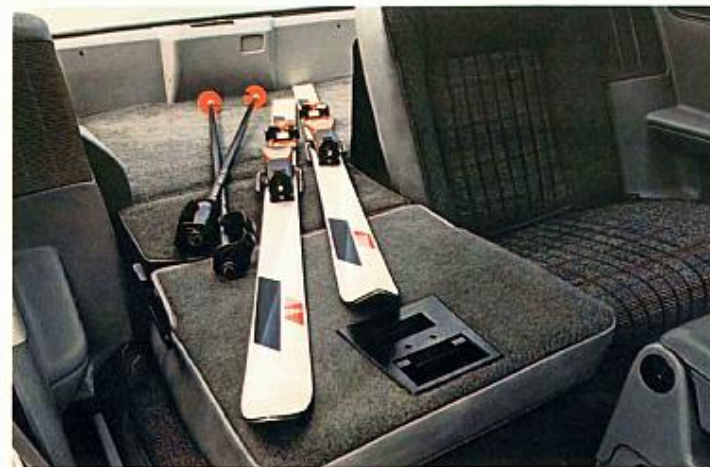

Mustang Environment

Comfort is something we all seek in an automobile. But comfort goes beyond the seats. The whole of the interior and how it works together to form a pleasing environment for driver and passengers alike is the total test of comfort.

Comfort: a key to control

Driving an automobile requires total concentration. When you're not comfortable, it takes away from that concentration. The Mustang interior — seats, climate control and entertainment systems all contribute to your comfort.

The front bucket seats are firm and supportive with high-density foam pads fitted over a spring steel base. The side bolsters provide a wraparound effect for good lateral support. In GT, the front articulated sport seats feature a power adjustable lumbar support plus an adjustable under-thigh support and side bolsters.

Climate control and entertainment systems

The climate control and entertainment systems are centered for

an equally easy reach for both driver and front passenger. The "Power Vent" heater/defroster has four blower speeds, four instrument panel registers and side window demisters for good circulation. And for year-round comfort there's optional air conditioning.

The standard AM/FM stereo search radio (may be deleted for credit) is electronically tuned to optimize reception and includes four speakers for listening enjoyment. As an option, order the electronic AM/FM stereo search radio with cassette tape player, Dolby® noise reduction and more. For the ardent audiophile, there is

firm and precise and provides a good feel of the road.

Controls for turn signals, high-beam, flash-to-pass and interval wipers are mounted on the steering column for fingertip access. The dual outside rearview mirrors are both remote controlled. As an option, you can order dual electric remote controlled mirrors.

A new-design center console has a driver-biased contour with an offset parking brake handle and clamshell-type armrest covering an accessory storage compartment.

Hatchback versatility

Mustang hatchbacks have split/



the seven-band graphic equalizer and/or Premium Sound System with a four-channel power amplifier and six speakers.

Mustang command center

The Mustang command center is designed to help keep the driver totally informed. A full complement of analog gauges for oil pressure, coolant temperature and battery voltage display the engine's operating conditions. A 6,000 rpm tachometer (7,000 on GT and with 5.0L EFI HO V-8 engine package) keeps track of engine rpm.

Power rack and pinion steering is

fold rear seat backs for extra versatility. Fold down one side for long cargo, like skis for example, and still have room for one rear seat passenger. Fold both seat backs down and you have nearly 30 cubic feet of carpeted cargo space (based on EPA volume index). A standard cargo area cover helps keep items out of the sun and out of sight.

The performance comes standard

Mustang GT is built for performance and unlike some other performance coupes, GT includes the things that performance stands for.

Things like the highest rated horsepower engine you can get in a Ford car. A firm, road-holding suspension system. An aerodynamically tuned, ground effects exterior. And an interior designed for the serious-minded driving enthusiast.

The GT drivetrain

The engine that powers Mustang GT puts out 225 horsepower at 4,000 rpm and 300-lb. ft. of torque at 3,200 rpm.* It includes numerous premium performance components detailed on page 15. The transmission is a Borg-Warner 5-speed manual with overdrive fifth. The Traction-Lok rear axle transfers the power to the road through Good-year Eagle unidirectional performance tires.

The GT suspension

The specially tuned suspension system of GT utilizes gas-pressurized struts and the Ford Quadra-Shock setup in the rear to go along with progressive rate springs and front and rear stabilizer bars.

Ground effects styling

Mustang GT has undergone a dramatic change in exterior styling. Besides making GT look better, the changes are designed to make it act

reminder lights for low fuel, low washer fluid, low coolant and a "check oil" reminder light. Even the brake and accelerator pedals are positioned to allow heel-and-toe downshifting and there's a left side foot rest/support for the driver during hard cornering.

Mustang GT Convertible

GT performance fun also comes in a convertible model complete with room for four. The top is



better, too. The use of a longer, low profile hood, front and rear fascias, front air dam, integrated fender extensions with air scoops, and the rear decklid spoiler and flush quarter glass on hatchbacks all contribute to improved vehicle air flow management and aerodynamic design.

The GT interior

Like the rest of the car, GT's interior is nothing less than exceptional. Take the seating for example. New for 1987 is a power adjustable lumbar support to go along with the adjustable thigh and side bolsters. The seat backs recline and the headrests adjust four ways.

A thick, soft-wrapped steering wheel tilts to five positions. The instrumentation includes 7,000 rpm tachometer, the addition of

power retractable with a rear glass window that can be left in place when you pop the top. And it can be unzipped and folded down with the top up for added ventilation.

Mustang options

You'll notice that until now, the words "optional" and "available" haven't been mentioned. That's because everything discussed on this page is "standard." Of course, you can order a number of great options, too. Like the 7-band graphic equalizer with premium sound. Or electric remote controlled rearview mirrors (standard on convertibles), and more. But when it comes to performance, GT already has it.

Ford Mustang—The Technical Side

Proven engineering principles form the Mustang advantage

Mustang's dynamic design provides a number of driving benefits. The sleek shape with flush aero-style halogen headlamps and flush quarter windows on sedans and hatchbacks help Mustang slip through the air with very little resistance. And through careful fine-tuning of selected design areas, air-flow is directed to reduce front and rear lift for directional stability and cornering agility.

Suspension design

The standard Mustang suspension uses gas-pressurized struts and stabilizer bar in front and gas-pressurized shocks in the rear. The rear suspension incorporates a proven 4-bar link design to help control axle movement.

Mustang GT suspension (included in the optional 5.0 liter EFI HO V-8 engine package available on LX models) includes components designed to match its higher performance capabilities. In the front are gas-pressurized struts, progressive rate springs and a larger stabilizer bar. In the rear are progressive rate springs and the Ford Quadra-shock set-up. It includes gas-pressurized shocks, stabilizer bar and two gas-filled, horizontally mounted axle dampers to help control axle movement and resist torsional roll.

Power assisted rack and pinion steering

Mustang's fun-to-drive attitude is reinforced by standard power assisted rack and pinion steering. The feel of rack and pinion is firm and precise and provides a good feel of the road. In Mustangs equipped with the 5.0L EFI HO V-8, the steering features a 15:1 steering gear ratio for fast response.

Multiple-port electronic fuel injection (EFI)

The 2.3 liter 4-cylinder engine that powers Mustang LX models features multiple-port electronic fuel injection for 1987. Multiple-port EFI includes individual ports at each cylinder intake valve for precise fuel metering. Principal benefits include improved overall operation, smooth running and easy starting in temperature extremes. Also new for '87 is the addition of the 5-speed manual overdrive transmission as standard equipment. As an option, the 2.3L engine can be ordered teamed to an automatic overdrive transmission.

Electronic engine control (EEC-IV)

The 2.3L 4-cylinder also benefits from the EEC-IV computer — a fourth generation microprocessor-based engine control system. EEC-IV is capable of thousands of operations per second. It instantly adjusts the air/fuel mixture and ignition timing for quick, cold starts. On the road, EEC-IV constantly senses what the engine is being asked to do, then balances the air/fuel mixture to maximize power, response and efficiency.

The high performance 5.0 liter EFI HO V-8

The High Output V-8 engine, standard in Mustang GT and optional in LX with the 5.0 liter EFI HO V-8 engine package, is rated at 225 horsepower at 4,000 rpm (SAE Standard J1349).* It also delivers 300 lb. ft. of torque at 3,200 rpm. Some of the components it uses to reach those impressive figures are sequential multiple-port fuel injection with electronic control; high performance forged camshaft; low friction roller tappets; forged aluminum pistons; stainless steel tuned tubular headers; large diameter dual exhausts and much more.

A standard 5-speed manual transmission with overdrive fifth gives you the ability to use all that power. Transferring it to the road is the responsibility of the Traction-Lok axle. With Traction-Lok, some power is automatically transferred to the wheel with the most traction.

Gas mileage

1987 EPA mileage estimates were not available at the time this catalog was approved for printing. As soon as EPA figures are released, your Ford Dealer will be among the first to receive this information and will be happy to pass it along to you.

The Special Value Group is one of three option groups detailed on page 17. These special groups include popular options and are designed to benefit you in two ways. They simplify the ordering procedure and many of the groups save you money. The savings are based on the manufacturer's suggested retail price for the package as compared to traditional suggested total price for the options purchased separately.

The Mustang LX 2-Door Sedan (Preferred Equipment Package 240A), pictured at the left, also includes the Special Value Group — at no extra charge — when you equip your new Mustang LX with the 2.3 liter engine.

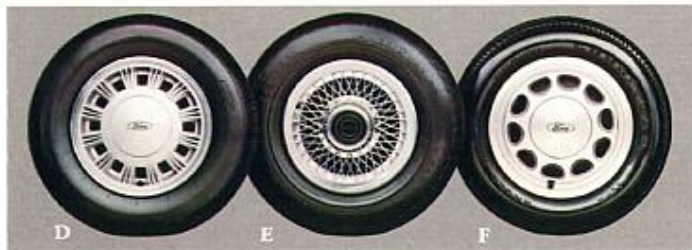
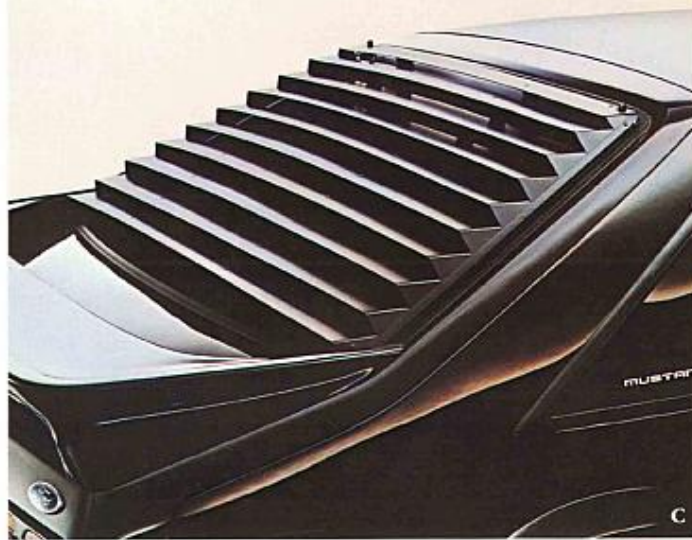

When ordering a Mustang built to your specifications, you may choose to have one or more of the features removed from the individual groups, but the discount would no longer apply.

Options and their availability are subject to change during the year. Some options may be subject to ordering restrictions. Your Ford Dealer can advise you of current status.

5.0L electronically fuel-injected V-8 engine package

You can order this engine package for your LX 2-door sedan, hatchback or convertible. Basically the package includes all the performance equipment that is standard on the GT. The package includes the 5.0L EFI HO V-8 engine; Traction-Lok axle; GT suspension system components; 15:1 steering ratio; heavy-duty battery; P225/60VR15 handling tires; cast aluminum wheels and fender badging.

The T-roof and flip-up open-air roof give you a way to soak up the warm weather in your Mustang hatchback.

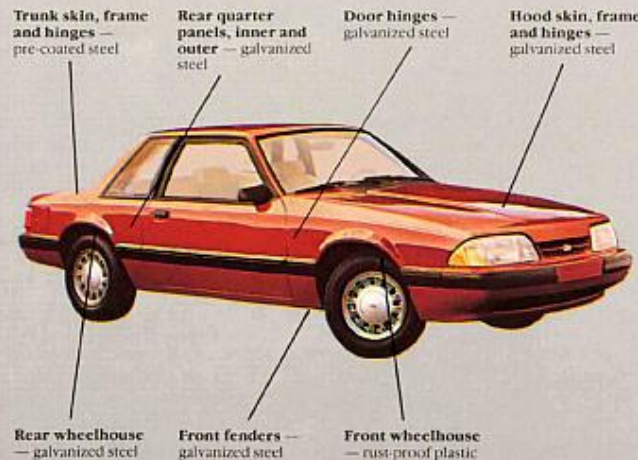

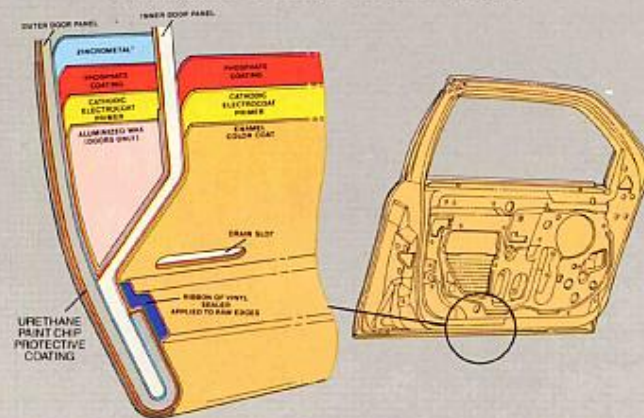


Special quality steps: corrosion protection

Ford's easy-to-install Tot-Guard (for children 20 to 50 pounds) and Infant Carrier (for children up to 20 pounds) are available at all Ford Dealers. If a child restraint requires a top-tether, Ford cars provide for attachment of an anchor at each rear outboard seating position (except Mustang Convertible models).

5-mile-per-hour bumpers
